

2B William Underwood

1A. John Underwood ca 1740-1811 of Surry County, North Carolina m. Margaret Jackman

2B. William Underwood, b. Feb. 17 or 19 1756; d. Dec. 20, 1814 in Anderson County, Tennessee. m. Susannah Kirby in Surry County, North Carolina February 28, 1782. The first record of this William Underwood was in the 1790 census of Wilkes County, North Carolina. To avoid confusion, it should be pointed out that Wilkes County was created in 1777 out of Surry County and the Washington District. In 1790 the northern part along Fisher and Mitchell Rivers was put back in Surry County through the efforts of Jesse Franklin who was their representative in the legislature. This Jesse Franklin played an important part in the lives of the Underwoods in this area. He was later governor of North Carolina for one term.

The next account of William Underwood was a deed from William Underwood to Zachariah Seaman in Surry County dated 1798. An excerpt reads:

William Underwood to Zachariah Seaman a deed This indenture made this tenth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight between William Underwood of the County of Knox and the State of Tennessee of the one part and Zachariah Seaman of the County of Surry and the State of North Carolina of the other part. Witnesseth that and for in consideration of the sum of forty pounds to me in hand paid by the said Zachariah Seaman have given, granted, bargain, and sell unto thee said Z. Seaman al that tract of parcel of land containing one hundred acres more or less beginning on Johns Creek a branch off Fisher River beginning at Joseph Ramsey's corner ---- the remainder was boundary lines.

Another deed was registered from William Underwood of Knox County, Tennessee to Samuel Riddle of Surry County, North Carolina, on February 167, 1798 for a consideration of eighty pounds for two hundred acres of land on Fisher River and Johns Creek bound by Jesse Franklin and Joseph Ramey exception one acre for the use of the Methodist Society whereon the Methodist Meeting house stands -----.

The above instrument was signed by Samuel Riddle but not by William Underwood. Joel Underwood acted as his brother's agent.

2B William Underwood

In Knox County, Tennessee Register of Deeds Office volume C 1, page 145 a deed dated October 1797 between James Litrell (probably Lutrell) of Knox County and William Underwood of Sevier County for the consideration of \$200.00 for 200 acres over the Big Ridge on the south side of Hinds Creek. An explanation is due here. So far as the records show William Underwood never lived in Sevier County. He must have stopped with his brother John Underwood who had settled in Dumplin Valley before 1795. Also the Big Ridge is called Copper Ridge today It is the dividing line between Knox and Anderson Counties. There is another deed in Knox County Register of Deeds Office dated September 16 1800 between John Umsted and William Underwood for 115 on Hinds Creek. (Deed Book F L Volume 2 page 166.)

Anderson County Tennessee was established out of Knox County by an act of the General Assembly in November 1801. On December 15 1801 the Court of Pleas and Quarters session was organized at the house of Joseph Denham Sr. The original justices were Hugh Montgomery William Underwood Frederick Miller James Grant John Kirby William McKamey Joseph Sinclair James Butler William Standifer and Soloman Massengil. They were appointed by Governor John Sevier upon good behavior. Miller, Underwood and Standifer were members of Knox County Court of Pleas and Quarters. Court of Pleas and Quarters was later known as Quarterly Court or County Court.

In the minutes of the Court of Anderson County 1811 1814 John Underwood Esq. Sheriff of Anderson County opened the October term of court. On October 17 1811, there was a case in court styled James Underwood vs. Issac Mayberry and on October 18 1811 there was another case styled John Underwood Administrator vs Quinn Morton. John Underwood was sheriff of Anderson County in 1801 and for several terms thereafter. In the Minutes of Court of Pleas and Quarters there is a deed from John and Susana Underwood to James Hill for three hundred acres of land. It was proved and ordered recorded. Exact date is not known. This was the last mention of John Underwood in this county. He was the son of William Underwood who will be referred to as 2B hereafter. Also the name of James Underwood disappeared from the records of Anderson County.

2B William Underwood

Last Will and Testament of William Underwood 1

In the name of God Amen I William Underwood of the State of Tennessee and County of Anderson in perfect mind and memory though weak in body considering the mortality of man that it (is) allotted one to die. I by these presents make and ordain this my last will and Testament in following form and manner to wit:

First I give and bequeath my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner

Secondly I give and bequeath for my just and lawful debts to be paid out off my estate.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Susannah Underwood my negro man Jack and all the rest of my estate that is not here after bequeathed during her life or widowhood.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy a certain tract of land that I purchased of Walter Alvis on the waters of Hines Creek adjoining my tract that I now live on beginning at the letter E on a post oak and bound a contract between said Alvis and myself.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sucky one hundred and fifty acres of land that I purchased of John Umsted reserving the benefit of the orchard and meadow to my wife during her life or widowhood.

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son Washington Underwood the tract of land I now live on and purchased of William Thompson 175 acres reserving the use and possession of said premises to my wife during her life or widowhood.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my two grandsons Sevier and Haywood Underwood sons of John and James Underwood a tract of land known as the mill tract to be equally divided between them. After the decease of my wife I wish all of the estate then remaining in her hands to be equally divided amongst Betsy Sucky Washington Sevier and Haywood Underwood.

Mrs. Mary Ruth Hemphill of West Point Mississippi says that she has verified that a Severe Underwood and wife Hezekial Kirby were living in Itawanda County Mississippi in 1840. Our speculation is that this was Sevier Underwood and his first wife and that Charlotte and Elizabeth Ann were his second and third wives. We already know that Sevier Underwood was in Morgan County Alabama in 1830. Itawanda County Mississippi is just two or three counties west of Morgan County Alabama. He seems to have been creeping westward every ten years.

"Dr. W. Q. Underwood came to Randolph County Mississippi neighborhood from Monroe County Mississippi during the latter part of the 1800's and was for many years a beloved physician in the western part of our county. Dr. Underwood was an uncle of P. F. Underwood President of Mississippi State Board of Health." by E. T. Winston, Ponotote Mississippi.

The record of James Underwood is very scant. He is mentioned several times in the Anderson County, Tennessee Court Minutes.

The 1830 Census of Anderson County Tennessee shows that he had one son under five, two between five and ten, three between ten and fifteen and one daughter between fifteen and twenty. He was between the ages of forty and fifty and the wife was between thirty (and forty

The 1840 Census of Rutherford County Tennessee shows a Haywood Underwood. It is not known if there is any connection with the Anderson County Family.

Haywood Underwood and Sevier Underwood were given land by the grandfather William Underwood (2B) in his will.

3C. _____bey Underwood b. April 13 1785; d. 1794. This child was probably named for his Mother's family Kirby. He died at about the age of nine.

QUOTES FROM MILITARY PAPERS

"State of Tennessee Anderson Co. on the 2nd day of March 1841, Susan Underwood a resident of Anderson Co. and age 88 years who being first duly sworn--- that she is the widow of William Underwood a capt. in the light horse militia in the service of the U.S. in the Revolutionary War. She cannot give any particular service rendered by her said husband. She heard him speak in his lifetime of being in several engagements with the enemy. She believed he belonged to Col. Mat Armstrong's regiment. He resided in Surry Co., NC. at the time he entered the service. He entered the service 27 Jan. 1780. and offered receipts and orders. She further states that she was married to said Underwood in Surry Co. NC on 28th Feb. 1782 and that her maiden name was Susan Kerby by which name she was fully known and that she had remained a widow since her husband died December 20 1814. (Rev. War Pension of NC w1003) Washington Underwood a son submitted a pension claim on his father Capt. William Underwood. John Underwood another son submitted a pension claim on his father Capt. William Underwood. From Roster of Soldiers from NC in the American Revolution: John Underwood Pvt. #1583)
