

2F JOHN UNDERWOOD

2F. John Underwood, b. December 14, 1767; d. March 14, 1858 in Sevier County, Tennessee. m. _____ Kirby

It is apparent that John Underwood 2F (1767 1858) was the first of this family to come to what is now Tennessee. In a deed found in Deed Book I (letter) page 425 in Surry County Court House Dobson, North Carolina, to wit:

"John Underwood to Henry Kirby (spelled 'Kerby') a Deed

This indenture made this third day of October and in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety five between John Underwood of the County of Sevear (sic) and Southwestern Territory on the one part and Henry Kerby of the County of Surry of North Carolina as the other part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of fifty-four pounds to me in hand paid by the said Henry Kerby have given, granted, bargained, and sold unto the said Henry Kerby all that tract or parcel of land supposed to be eighty-five acres beginning at the mouth of Johns Creek running about an East course to a pine on the point of a hill thence along a line of marked trees North East course through the dry pond to an (d) oak on the east of the road in the Henry Kerby's line thence a west course a long the said line crossing Johns Creek to a chestnut thence south to the roaring creek to a white oak thence down said creek to the beginning together with all and singular the houses, buildings, plantations etc thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining with all and singular the roads, mines, minerals, waters, and water courses with their and every of their appertanances and advantages thereunto belonging I hereby delinguish all the estate rights I claim and command whatsoever to the said lands and premises with theirs and every of their advantages confirming the same to the said Henry Kerby his heirs and assigns forever warranting and defending the said bargained premises free and against from all dowers rights and claims of all persons whatsoever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal the day and year above written.

Surry County, August Session 1802. The execution of the within was proved in open Court by the oath of Jesse Franklin one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be registered.

It is probable that this Henry Kirby was the father-in-law of John Underwood. (2F) This has not been authenticated but it is known that John Underwood's first wife was a Kirby. Also, William Underwood (1A. 2B) married Susannah Kirby probably a sister.

The deed above indicates that John Underwood (2F) was the first of four brothers to come to the new territory over the mountains. In deeds in Knox County's Register of Deeds Office in Knoxville, Tennessee, two of the brothers, William and George, were designated as being from Sevier County. Since there is no record that they owned land there, they may have joined their brother, John (2F), prior to establishing themselves as land owners.

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There were at least two other deeds in the Surry County, North Carolina, Court Clerk's Office in which John Underwood was the grantor. One was a deed from John Underwood to Amos Gallyon in 1798 for a "certain tract or parcel of land" for the consideration of forty pounds (see Book G, page 263). Another was a deed from John Underwood to Richard Isabell in 1802 for one hundred and twenty-five acres and a consideration was "one hundred and twenty-five Spanish milled dollars." The land was "on the roaring Gap Creek a branch of fisher river being a part of my old tract no. 16." This could have been John Underwood sen. or otherwise designated herein as.(1A) John Underwood (1767-1858).

2F. John Underwood, b. Dec. 14, 1767, d. March 14, 1858 1 m. 1st _____ Kirby who was the daughter of either Henry or Kit Kirby listed in Wilkes County, North Carolina, Census 1790 and later residents of Surry County due to changes in county lines. This John Underwood settled in Dumplin Valley in the old 8th District Sevier County, Tennessee, on a tract of land he bought from William Mount. 2

There were three other girls named Elizabeth, Sarah and Mary. There is very little record but they were mentioned in John Underwood's will. They can not be identified in any census. It is known that Elizabeth married Allen Bryan while Sarah or Sally married a Crimons (if that is the correct spelling) and Mary married a Carr. The Carrs went to Texas. She must have died before 1855 because only her children were mentioned in the will of her father, John Underwood. He willed his grand children, Lawson Carr and Elizabeth Riggs of Texas land in Mercer County, Missouri. He had bought this and from his son, Thomas Underwood (2F, 3E), when Thomas came back from Missouri.

For reasons cited above, the three daughters of John Underwood will not be numbered in the usual manner but by 3X, 3Y, and 3Z until more exact information can be obtained. However, Elizabeth's husband, Allen Bryan was reported to have served as a member of the Sevier County Quarterly Court and as a member of the Tennessee State Legislature. Allen Bryan, Esq. performed the ceremonies at the marriage of James C. and Synthy Cate Pollard in 1843. 4 It is also interesting to note that John Underwood (2F, 3B), Susan or Susannah Cate (2F, 3C), Nancy Underwood (2F, 3B), and Elizabeth Bryan (2F, 3X) were only willed one dollar while all of the other children were given considerable lands and/or money.

There must have been a family disagreement and it was possibly over the father's second or third marriage. This is one reason to think that the daughters numbered 3X, 3Y, and 3Z were of the first family.

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Another reason to make this assumption is that there was a space of seven or eight years between Nancy Underwood (2F, 3B) and Susannah (2F, 3C). Also it was during this time that they came from North Carolina to Tennessee. According to the census records of places of birth, Susannah was the first one found to show being born in Tennessee

3X. Elizabeth Underwood, b. 16 March 1786; d. 24 October 1862 in Sevier County, Tennessee. m. Thomas (?) Bryan probably in North Carolina (b. 17 Dec. 1772; d. 14 March 1839) The reason for the odd number is that it was not clear which family she belonged to. The same was true of Sarah and Mary.

Elizabeth and Allen Bryan must have married in North Carolina before they came to the western counties. According to Caruthers the Underwoods and the Bryans were on opposite sides during the American Revolution. The Underwoods were Whigs and the Bryans were Tories. Allen Bryan was probably the son of Thomas Bryan. Allen Bryan served in the 9th, 11th, and the 14th session of the General Assembly of Tennessee.

This Bryan family acquired considerable lands along the north side of the French Broad River in Sevier County, Tennessee. Some of this land is still in the possession of the descendants as this is written in 1984

4? Margaret Bryan, no record except that she married Samuel Henry, the son of Major Hugh Henry. It was this family that gave Henry's Cross Roads Church its name.

4? Elizabeth Bryan, b. March 4, 1817; d. March 21, 1898. She is buried in Saffell Cemetery and has a marker. m. 1st. Harvey Underwood. He was the son of John Underwood, by his second wife Elizabeth Manifold. Harvey Underwood was born May 22, 1810; d. Sept. 11, 1840. No record of children. m. 2nd. George Ambrister Nov. 27, 1857 in Sevier County, No record of children. m. 3rd. James M. Carter July 20/31, 1860. Her tombstone is inscribed with the words, "Aunt Betsy".

4?. William M. Bryan, b. April 10, 1819; d. April 17, 1860 m. Carolyn Scruggs (Carolyn Scruggs Bryan married Dr. William Thomas after Dr. Bryan died. They had two children. One, Lula Thomas who married Charles Walker with one child, Rose Walker who married Hugh Nichols and later Harlan Walker who was a professional baseball player. The other Thomas daughter married a Blair.

Note: The Henry's Cross Roads School was built by the community in 1900. It had two rooms. The teachers were Robert Huffaker for high school grades and Washington Baker who taught elementary grades.

Note; In the Sevier County Census of 1870 these children were listed: Sarah age 24, Mary age 22, Allen B. age 20, Nancy T. age 18, Manervy age 16, Samuel N. age 11, and Minnie age 2. Samuel Saffell had at least three children Sam'l, Carland Callie. Grave markers in the Saffell Cemetery on the north side of the French Broad River in Sevier County, Tennessee, just below Douglas Dam show: Callie Saffell, b. Aug. 18, 1867; d. Jan. 8, 1879; Minnie Saffell b. Nove. 30, 1867; d. Jan. 8, 1877; Allen B. Saffell m. Sallie Maples Dec. 19, 1895 in Knox County, Tennessee.

4? Acy Bryan, b. Jan. 15, 1829; d. Jan. 6, 1843. This child was listed as Ashley in 1850 census but in 1860 as Acy, a female. No further record has been found.

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"On February 5, 1806, Joshua Gist conveyed his home plantation of 200 acres and the 100 acres he bought from Issac Taylor to Abraham Scott. When Scott failed to pay the sum agreed to, Joshua Gist brought suit against him in the 1807 February Term of Court for Sevier County, Tennessee. When Joshua later sold this track to Bennett Bogges she had difficulty in clearing the title. In 1813, a suit was brought against Joshua Gist's son Mordicai Gist, deceased -- Elender Gist, Joshua Gist, and Spencer Gist -- by Bennett Bogges and John Underwood. 5 Original Papers in case of John Underwood vs. Joshua Gist, Nathaniel Gist, Bennett Bogges and Spencer Clark, guardian of the heirs at law of Mordecai Gist, filed May 29, 1812 in Supreme Court of Errors and Appeals for the Circuit Court. To date, the writer has been unable to find this case. The reason for inserting this at this time is to show when John Underwood acquired and probably moved from Dumplin Valley to the Bend of the River. (1812-1813) Ramsey, on page 274, writes: "The conference was held at Gist's, now Underwood's." He was writing in reference to a dispute between one James Hubbard and the Indians. Captain James White was the mediator.

The name was spelled in several ways including Kimes, Kims, and Kymes. This family lived south of the French Broad River. Other members of this family that were married in Knox County were:

4. Samuel Conner to Margaret Kims Nov. 29, 1825 by b. McNutt, J. P. This couple were the parents of Elizabeth or Betty Conner who became George Underwood's second wife. She was a niece of the first wife. There was a George Conner also. the B. McNutt was Benjamin McNutt who was described by Ramsey as an early settler and Indian fighter who lived south of the French Broad River.

The first wife of George Underwood was probably given a dowery in land. George Underwood sold two tracts of land "south of the French Broad and north of Bays Mountains". One tract of land joined that of Abraham Kims. This sale of land was to Samuel Widner in 1837 and witnessed by Wm. Widner and James Perry. 6 This land was also joined by Jacob Wrinkle

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3A. George Underwood (1791 - 1865) (2F, 3A) went back from Knox County to Sevier County some time before 1830. He was in the 1830 Census in Sevier County. He bought the original homesite from his father, John Underwood (1767 - 1858) in 1837. A Federal Land Bank abstract in possession of Mrs. Alice Hodges McCall, Kodak, Tennessee from Deed Book "F", page 639, reads as follows:

January 6, 1837, John Underwood to George Underwood

Being a part of a track of land conveyed from William Mount to John Underwood. Consideration \$400.00. Acknowledged before Issac J. Miller C. C. of Sevier County 19 April 1839. Reg. 22 April 1839

Elizabeth Kymes Sept. 16, 1815 in Knox County, Tennessee by B. McNutt, Esq. The name Kimes was also spelled Kims and Kymes. Elizabeth was probably the daughter of Matthew Kimes who lived south of the French Broad River toward Bays Mountain. At any rate, George Underwood sold two tracts of land joining Abraham Kimese which must have been Elizabeth's dowery. This was in 1839 the year George Underwood bought land in Sevier County joining the land he obtained from his father John Underwood. George Underwood was reported to have lived in the Tuckahoe area of Knox County until about 1826 or 1827.

She later married Perry Cate, the son of Joshua Cate. They lived on the hill overlooking Cate's Cross Roads. This place later became known as the "Joe Moore place". Perry Cate was a brother to Madison Cate who married Sarah's younger sister Martha A. Underwood. They lived on the next hill just west of Perry and Sarah.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE KNOXVILLE BAR ON THE DEATH OF GENERAL GEORGE WESLEY PICKLE

General Pickle was the son of Jonathan and Margaret Underwood Pickle and was born and reared on a farm in Knox County. At an early age, he manifested great independence of thought and great courage and determination in maintaining his convictions. When the Civil War began in 1861, he was barely 16 years old, and nearly all of his neighbors and friends were ardently in favor of The Union, and most of the young men whom he had known and was associated with all his life, joined the Union Army. Young Pickle had thought the matter out for himself and reached a conclusion to join the Confederate Army. His Guardian and friends persistently and urgently labored to change his purpose, but without avail. He entered the Confederate Army, as a private soldier, and served with credit to himself and his cause. He was confined as a prisoner of war in a Federal prison for many months, and returned home broken in health; but undaunted, he set about preparing himself for the Bar, to which he was soon admitted. He attended the Princeton University, and then went to Indiana, where he studied law with Hon. D. W. Vorhees, one of the leading lawyers of his time. Then began the real activities of his life, and he was a bold, aggressive, forceful and persistent advocate. His high qualities soon gave him a commanding position at the Bar, and his labors brought him great success and prominence.

He first settled at Sevierville. Afterward he went to Newport, and still later to Dandridge. In January, 1879, he formed a partnership with W. R. Turner, which has continued uninterruptedly up to the time of his death.

In 1881, while he resided at Dandridge, he was married to Miss Minnie Fain of that place, and for 36 years they have journeyed together in that perfect union and perfect understanding, which make a happy marriage and a happy home. She and one daughter, Miss Minnie Wesley Pickle, survive him.

In 1886, he was made Attorney General of the State, which Office he filled for two terms, or 16 years. Twenty-four volumes of Tennessee Reports were edited and issued by him, and his system of digesting and indexing his cases, is universally commended. He has ably represented the State in the State Courts and in the United States Courts in some of the most important cases the State has ever handled.

General Pickle, removed to Knoxville in 1892, and in 1902, retired voluntarily from the Office of Attorney General, and devoted himself to the practice of his chosen profession. The reputation he had made as Attorney General, together with his well known ability, brought him a large and lucrative practice, which he handles with marked success, up to the year 1915, when his health failed.

In his family relations, General Pickle was exceptionally kind, affectionate and generous. In his friendship, he was faithful and unwavering. As a citizen, he was upright, public spirited, courteous and labored actively for the general good.

This good and interesting man was born March 6, 1845, and died at 2:20 A. M. Wednesday, April 18, 1917 at the age of 72. (He is buried at Greenwood Cemetery in Knoxville, Tennessee.)

Know all men by the presents that I, Darius Robertson being in feeble health but sound of mind and disposing memory make and publish this my last will and Testament revoking all former wills by me made at anytime.

First, It is my will that my burial expenses shall be paid out of any money that I may leave on hand at my death.

Second, It is my will that my beloved wife Mary Jane (Underwood) shall have all of my household and kitchen furniture during her life or widowhood, also all of my land money left on hand and all of my personal property. It is further my will that my said wife shall have all of my land and real estate during her life or widowhood to control and manage as she thinks to be her best interest.

Third, It is my will that should my wife die before my youngest children shall become of age to wit twenty-one years old, then they are to remain at the homestead and have control and the benefit of all my lands and other property for a home provided that any of my children who are and may be unmarried shall have the same right as the minors to make this their home and receive a support from said farm and property and shall have the same right of control of the minors. But this shall not apply to them should they marry and set up for themselves.

Fourth, It is my will that at the death of my wife, Mary Jane, should she live beyond the date when my youngest child shall become of age and if then when my Youngest attains the age of twenty-one, all of my personal and real property including money shall be equally divided among all of my children to wit; Elizabeth Shepard, Sarah Catherine Maples, Clarrissa Sharp, George C. Robertson, Emily Butler, M. C. Robertson, Rebecca P. Robertson, D. L. Robertson, and Martha Adeline Robertson: Provided that if those of my children who have not received a horse still at that time or its equivalent then in that event I desire such children to have a horse not to exceed \$85.00) eighty-five dollars in value. Then all my property as foresaid to be equally divided among all my children. It is my will that my land be sold at the death of my wife or when my youngest child becomes of age by my executor and the proceeds be divided among my children instead of having the land divided among them.

Fifth, I hereby appoint and constitute as my executor to wind up my business and Carry out the provisions of this my last will M. C. Robertson..

All of the first family of children were born in Knox County except William Henderson Underwood and possibly Mary Jane Underwood (2F, 3A, 4H) who was born in 1837.

Although William Henderson "Hense" Underwood was born in Sevier County, Tennessee, he married his cousin Elizabeth Underwood who lived in Knox County. They lived on a farm adjoining her father Joel Underwood. The farm was known as the James Underwood farm. This James Underwood (2F, 3G) sold this farm to George Underwood when he went to Missouri. William Henderson Underwood was later willed this property by his father. The land was along the north bank of the French Broad River and the "river road" passed through it.

After Elizabeth Underwood died, William Henderson Underwood married her sister, Rhoda Isabella Underwood and reared the children of both wives at this location.

Will of George Underwood (2F, 3A) 24

I, George Underwood being weak in body but perfect in mind and memory and calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men to die do make my last will and testament.

First, I give my soul unto the hands of God that gave it, and my body to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the descretion of my Executor. (John H. Caldwell)

Second, I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Underwood the farm I now live on and the farm commonly known as John Underwood farm with all their profits, rents, etc. til my four youngest children become of lawful age, to educate and support them during their minority, and the part of the tract of land lying north of Dumplin Creek for the same purpose. I also give to her two head of horses, the old mare and filly, also my wagon and farming tools, two sows and four shoats. I also give her all of my household and kitchen furniture and all my sheep and poultry and I also give Elizabeth Underwood the farm with my dwelling house and all appurtenances and the Davis tract north of Dumplin Creek during her natural life to support herself and to support James Anderson Underwood, a minor child, and at her death to descend to said minor child, and the said James Anderson Underwood pay unto Parthena, a minor child \$300 when she becomes of lawful age. I also give unto Robert Sneed Underwood the farm known as the John Underwood farm when he becomes of lawful age by his paying Nancy Cordelia Underwood another minor \$300. I also give to William Henderson Underwood the farm known as the James Underwood farm by him paying me \$600, and John Underwood \$600, and also George kirby Underwood \$600. I also give to Elizabeth Mount, Sarah Cate, Susan Linnie Cate, Martha Adeline Cate, and Mary Jane Robertson the balance of my Davis farm lying south of Dumplin Creek to be divided between them or sold and the money divided among them equally or to be divided as they please. My desire is that my blacksmith tools and other property not mentioned to be sold by my Executor and the money divided between the above menioned daughters.

It is interesting to note that a "friendly court suit" was filed September 14, 1881, in Chancery Court in Sevier County by William H. and Parthenia C. Hodges against James A. Underwood (4K above) and Elizabeth Green, then the wife of Robert Green, who had abandoned her. She had earlier been the second wife of George Underwood whose will is found within these pages.

From the will we quote: ".....and the said James A. Underwood pay unto Parthenia Underwood, a minor child \$300.00 when she becomes of lawful age."

James Anderson Underwood was described in the suit as a natural deaf mute with no knowledge or education and unable to pay the claim against the estate. The court decided that a sufficient area of land to satisfy the claim against the homestead dower of Elizabeth Green and James A. Underwood be sold. It specified the part of the Davis tract north of "Dumpling Creek". William H. Hodges and Parthenia C. Hodges bought the land to satisfy their claim.

So far as is known, Nancy Cordelia Underwood Goforth never pressed her claim against the estate.

It could be he had already given her lands.) to have and to hold the same to her heirs and assigns forever. Also I give to my wife Polly (her name was listed as Mary in Sevier County Census 1850 so this could be a nickname.) Underwood a certain tract known as the old Collens tract containing one hundred acres more or less adjoining the lands of Joanna's above mentioned to have and to hold the same and dispose of the same as she may deem proper to her heirs and assigns forever also an other piece adjoining the last mentioned of six acres which includes the water which I desire shall be divided equally between my wife Polly and Joanna Bales my daughter to be used and held by them as above. 34 It is interesting to note that John Underwood signed his earlier wills and other documents. This use of a "mark" may have been due to his advanced age and resultant physical condition. However, some researchers believe that the use of a "mark" was considered more official or authoritative and viewed by people of this period to be similar to a seal used by Office holders. A written signature may have been viewed only as a written name and not necessarily in the same manner as a signature noting agreement or affirmation as do our contemporaries.

I will that my mill stones now on the farm of my son Joel be sold after my decease and that the money be equally divided between my son Thomas' sons John, James, William, Ephriam, White, Samuel and Joel. In the U. S. Census of 1830 Knox County, Tennessee, Thomas Underwood was listed as being 25-30 in age and a female of about the same age was listed but no children are included. It is thought she was from the Jesse Huffaker line but there is no proof of record. They must have married in Sevier County where the records were destroyed. However, there was a marriage license issued to Thomas Underwood and Elizabeth Johnson on Oct. 30, 1834 in Knox County, Tennessee.

Thomas was a member of the Knox County Court in 1837. From the Court record: "Thomas Underwood having tendered to the court his resignation as Justice of the Peace for Knox County. It is accepted by the court and ordered to be Entered on the Record."

This could have been when he went to Missouri. In the John Underwood (1767 - 1858) will he gave his two grand children, Elizabeth Riggs, and Lawson Carr of Texas, one quarter section of land in Mercer County, Missouri which was purchased of his son Thomas Underwood. He also gave his son Thomas Underwood's sons his home tract of land which was in the Underwood bend of French Broad River, later know as the "Bent". He even named the sons of Thomas Underwood in order to identify them.

It was reported that Harvey was fifteen years old when the family left for Missouri in an ox wagon. This event would be about 1857 or close to this date. In George Underwood's 2F, 3A) will is the following statement: "I also give Wm. Henderson Underwood the farm known as the James Underwood farm by his paying me \$600.00 and John Underwood (2F 3A 4C) \$600.00 and also George Kirby Underwood \$600.00."

This George Underwood was James Underwood's older half brother, and John and George Kirby Underwood were George Underwood's sons.

In Underwood Families of America, page 672, #1353: "John Underwood of East Tennessee married and had at least one son James of Ash Grove, Greene County, Missouri, born _____ in East Tennessee who married and had children.. James was spoken of as an old man in 1885 and lived two miles west of Ash Grove, Missouri."

There was one peculiar thing about John Underwood's will in that it did not mention his daughter, Margaret Underwood, who married John Randles. 45 However, in the Knox County Register of Deeds Office a deed is recorded in which he gave her three hundred acres of land in Knox County "for the love and affection he had for his daughter Margaret Randles". The deed was witnessed by Payne McClary and John Kelly of Sevier County.

John Underwood and Mary Huffaker must have married in Sevier County about 1828 or 1829. No record of this is found in Knox County, Tennessee. John's son, Joel, had married Mary's daughter, Sarah Huffaker. Therefore, John and Mary had common grandchildren before they married. They were the first mentioned in his will.
