The first record found of Thomas Underwood in Tennessee was a deed in the Quarterly Court Minutes of Jefferson County, Tennessee, dated September 10, 1823, for one hundred and one acres of land from William Cate to Thomas Underwood. This land was west in the village of Dumplin.

The same Minute Book tells us that a jury was appointed on Dec. 10, 1823, to "lay off a road through Thomas Underwood's land to the Sevier County line." The jury included John E. Cate, Humphrey Mount, William Dodson, David Thorpe, Joshua Newman and Thomas Mount. This road went toward the settlement of John Underwood, an older brother of Thomas Underwood and his son his son Enoch Underwood. This road was later called Dumplin Valley Road.

It was a surveyor's report which was not destroyed in the Court House fire which burned most of the records in 1856. There is a tax receipt on file 1818. It was for 49 and 34 cents to Enoch Underwood. There is a deed on file for ninety-four acres from Enoch Underwood to Ira Underwood for a consideration of fifty dollars. This is the same land which Enoch Underwood settled on which was in sight of the land on which John Underwood first settled. This land may have been a part of the original grant to John Underwood in 1795. This deed from Enoch to (son) Ira Underwood was dated April 6, 1872.

An interchange on Interstate I40 was built to connect that highway with Sevierville and the Great Smoky Mountain National Park. The road is named The Gov. Winfield Dunn Parkway in honor of the governor of Tennessee at the time of the construction of the connector. Both homesites of the original home of John Underwood and Enoch Underwood were taken in this project. The land was owned by Samuel Hodges, a great, great grandson of Enoch Underwood. Samuel "Sammy" Hodges was a member of the Sevier County Quarterly Court as was his progenitor, Enoch Underwood in 1855.

Enoch Pleasant "Pless" Underwood was reported to have had a post office called Sinking Springs some where in the Tuckahoe area. He also ran the family tannery on Tuckahoe Creek. He was noted for the fine quality of leather he tanned. The horse collars the half Sweeny which he made were very much in demand. He also raised and twisted a fire cured tobacco which he sold along with his leather good. He sold (his wares from a covered wagon. His friends affectionately called him "Coodle".

Enoch Pleasant Underwood was prominent in masonry (Free and Accepted Masons) in Sevier and Jefferson Counties. He was raised a mason May 2, 1873, in Mountain Star Lodge #197 at Sevierville, Tennessee. 8 He withdrew from #197 to become a charter member of Strawberry Plains Lodge #462. He was the Tiler of that lodge for a number of years. He withdrew from the Strawberry Plains Lodge in 1895 to become a charter member of the French Broad Lodge #588 in 1905. This lodge met in a store or a warehouse on the bank of French Broad River at the mouth of Dumplin Creek. Other charter members were J. Kerr Underwood, Leonard Joseph Underwood, M. Henderson Underwood, Newton Thomas Underwood, and Enoch Underwood Huffaker. Harvey Nelson Underwood and Ephriam S. Underwood, sons of Enoch Pleasant Underwood, were early members of this lodge. This lodge was later moved to the store owned by Harvey N. Underwood where Harvey N. Underwood started the Kodak, Tennessee, post office. There was a post office named Kathleen, a forerunner of Kodak.

The following are excerpts from the diary and day book of Enoch Underwood (2G, 3A) written during the Civil War and typed as these notations are recorded in his handwriting. This gives a contempory view of the war as it passed over the Sevier and Jefferson Counties and illustrates why much of the area is still so strongly Republican in it's politics:

"Sent \$1 to Brownlow for the Knoxville Whig for six months. In the fall of 1862 gave I. N. Underwood \$20. in good money to buy salt. settled Jan. 1. 1864. Gave I. N. \$20. to get his mare from the confeds.

1863 the boy laid out all summer to keep from being conscripted. The last days of august the federals took Knoxville and relieved us.

The 15th of Nov. 1863 the confederates lay siege to Knoxville continued 20 to 30 days ------ they moved to mossy creek ruining the country as they went. roaming over the county searching for provision robbing citizens caring off everything without paying for it.

Jan. 16th 1864 a fight at Dandridge. the federals retreated to Strawberry Plains, the Confeds pursuded to Newmans mill on dumplin.

Jan. 20th came to Underwoods and others mill took John Elder (2G, 3F) and others prisoners.

Jan. 21st tremendous canonade at the plains

Jan. 22 1864 all quite at the plains

Jan. 23 the rebels filled all cross roads guarding every bunch of corn.. Took Elijah Cate prisoner and hung (Ed. note: Legend is he was cut down before he died.) broke into I. N.'s house. no damage much. (24th 6 rebels past here with John's horses searched his house but no other damage

Feb. 3, 1864 the rebels took my sorrel filly searched my house they pd for arms

6th cam into I.N.'s house robbed it pretty bad his corn and molasses

7th done the same thing again

8th came back with Dav Jones took more corn and took George's corn.

9th tore up I.N.'s .(not clear) and took more corn.

10th took the balance of his property

10th took my corn and hay

17th Several days of tolerable quite. Rebels stationed at Strawberry Plains.

22nd rebels falling back after taking all the horses and provisisons of the country.

29th The boys coming back. The whole country badly scared and alarmed.

March 30th I got my sorrell filly Harold Smith's in Jefferson Co.

Capt. \_almerson of Chattanooga, Hugh Henry and Goodson belong to a rebel raid that took my horse worth \$100. on the 18th of Nov. 1864 and on the same day the same raid took Elijah Cate's horse worth \$150.

April the 22nd Received from John Underwood \$2 for the season of one black mare. paid to G. W. Sellers

Blunt Evans had five pairs of shoes made and it is to go on his note. settled.

Accounts Elbert Cate gave me to collect for him: I. M. Griffin \$6.00 Thomas Ferguson \$6.00 A. M. Cate \$6.00, Buck Hodge 74cts George Conner 35cts.

The notice above concerning Elender Newman verifies the note in the Greene letter that John Underwood's wife was a Newman. Evidently this John Underwood owned one of the grain mills on Dumplin Creek in Jefferson County near where his father lived, according to his letter. It is also apparent that the sons, William and Enoch, cast their lots with the Confederacy during the Civil War. The father, John, must have been loyal to the Union.

There was a Martin D. Underwood, age 21, listed in the 1860 Census of Bradley County. (#333). We are unable to establish any relationship and leave it to future researchers to identify this person and his relatives.

#### John Underwood's Will

Bradley Count, Tennessee, 1st. Feb. 1868. I, John Underwood, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other former wills and Testaments by me at any time made.

I want my part of the mill sold at private sale for ready money and appropriated to paying off my debts. I want the money that is yet coming to me for the land off the West side of the farm I sold to W. E. Rucker collected. I want Manerva Haymes paid out of this money that is collected after the Marsh debt is collected and Carter O'Neil and Davis paid first and then my land redeemded and the balance applied to paying the debts of W. H. Underwood deceased that is against the House at Cleveland. I want my wife and daughter Martha to have the proceeds of the farm that yet remains ninety acres of land until the date of their marriage if they don't marry they can have it until their death. I do not allow them to sell any part of the farm not ever in their lifetime estate and if there is any money left after paying my debts I want it loaned out on interest. I want the land equally divided. I want what property that E. R. Underwood and W. H. Underwood deceased and Melissa Oldham have received deducted from what they have of that is their share after division of the land. I want Manerva Haymes Mahala E. Rucker and Martha Jane Underwood and their heirs to have the land and the other equally divided between all the heirs of the above named six children of equal value. The land that I did not sell to William E. Rucker I want them to have an equal divide after the death or marriage of Sarah E. and Martha Jane Underwood. i want them to keep the personal property that belonged to the farm. Cattle, Horses, hogs, House furniture to keep until the date of their marriage or death. They are not to sell or spend anything without it toward keeping up the farm or paying the debts. My wife is to have those things until her marriage or death, if there is money left after debts I want it equally divided between my children and heirs. After their death I want Malissa Oldham to have her house on the Hill also where she is now living and Manervy Hames one end of the West room of the House of her own. I hereby appoint Manervy Hames my Executrix divide up every part of my estate in witness hereunto I have set my hand and affixed my seal this the day and date above written.

Observations: John Underwood's wife was Sarah E. Newman. Her mother, Elender Newman, was living with the family in 1860. E. R. Underwood was Enoch, named for his grandfather, Enoch Underwood, the R. was possibly for Ramey, his grandmother's maiden name.

It is not clear whether Enoch R. Underwood was dead or not when this will was written but W. H. Underwood was dead according to the letter dated 1865. He must have been killed in the Civil War. He had married a girl from Walker County, Georgia. It is not known who Enoch R. Underwood married or if there were any children of either son.

The letter beginning on the next page is from John Underwood (1810 - 186?) to his brother, Enoch Underwood (1792-1877) and sons Ira Nelson and John Underwood. The mill in question was in the Dumplin community of Jefferson County, Tennessee. It was known as Newman Mill, founded by Joshua Newman. It was given to his daughter who married John Underwood of Cleveland, Tennessee.

February 13th 1865

Cleveland, Tennessee

Dear Brother and Friends

I seat myself this morning to inform you that we are yet in the land of the living blessed with reasonable health hoping these lines may find you all enjoying like blessings.

I rec'd a letter from you and I. N. Underwood some time ago informing me of an attempt to confiscate the mill. I am more than thankful to the kind friend who interferred in the business. I want him to take pay out of the mill for his time and expenses while attending to that business. He no doubt saved me from a great deal of trouble and expense. The men who attempted such a thing was barking up the wrong tree certain for I can prove my Loyality by 500 of the most prominent citizens of this county if need be for I was a member of the County court when this rebellion came up and my actions was publick. I have proved my Loyality by the clerks of the Circuit and County Courts, by the Chairman of the County Court and other Justices of the Peace and by the Sheriff of the County and will send it as you decide.

As far as Wm. H. Underwood's interest in the mill is concerned they cannot confiscate a dead man's property (ed. note: this Wm. H. Underwood was his son who was eighteen years old in 1850 U. S. Census. He was not located in the 1860 Census. He had married a girl from Walker Co., GA. The legend is he was a lawyer. He must have cast his lot with the Confederacy.)

I send the Power of Attorney to I. N. Underwood and John Underwood to attend to my business for me. I want them to do the best they can for me make settlements collect money etc. If you and them think best they may put the mill to the highest Bidder for cash rent for 12 months payable monthly or quarterly taking bond and security for the taking care of the mill and delivering it up at the expiration of the term and also for the payment of the rent

We have had a tolerable hard time in this country. The rebs took nearly everything we had the fall of 1853 (ed. note: this surely was meant for 1863) since the Federal army took possession of this county we have lived in comparative safety. They respecting our rights and acting justly toward the citizens and upon the whole we are doing as well as could be expected under Military Rule. But recently the Rebel guerillas has been Raiding through this county Murdering citizens and robbing houses and stealing horses. They came some time ago and murdered Erby Cooper at the hour of midnight in 1 mile of my house. They killed Alfred Johnson a few days ago. P. A. Haggard (ed. note: Pleasant Atchley Haggard married Elizabeth Calahan, a niece of John Underwood. See Atchely Family.) and a scout of about 12 soldiers went to try to get his body. They fired on them captured one soldier and killed him. They captured Haggard and a solder with whom he as acquainted had him released. A week ago they came through the west part of this county and through Hamilton county and took off all of the horses and mules and shot W. Hunter of Georgetown. If the Federal Authorities does not send calvery reinforcements here it will be impossible to make a crop here.

I voted for A. Lincoln and A. Johnson Believing that the policy of the Administration the only one that would secure a permanent peace. I shall vote ratification to the amendments to the constitution if permitted by the Rebs to do away with slavery the curse of Families the curse of communities and the great curse of this nation so that our grand children will not share the fate of us and or children.

Wm. E. Rucker is yet in the 4th E. Tenn. Cav. J. C. Oldham lives on my farm. E. R. Underwood (ed. note: this was Enoch R.) family lives near me. Minervia lives with me. Wm. H. Underwood's widow lives with her father in Walker Co. Ga. Please write soon and ofter. Write whether John Douglas is yet alive.(ed. note: This John Douglas married John's older sister Margaret Underwood.) Write about every person that I would be interest in hearing from.
